Description

This two-week intensive course is designed to familiarize professionals with epidemiological techniques that help to determine the impacts of disasters and conflicts. The course will be given by a renowned international faculty and will introduce participants to the methods and tools of epidemiology in the context of humanitarian emergencies. Upon successful completion participants receive a university certificate and 10 ECTS credits.

All applicants require English fluency.

Key themes: Malnutrition, mortality, morbidity, population displacement, and EPI computer applications.
